

The network includes Finance Finland's member organisations and 24 educational institutions.





Hackathon brings students together around the theme of AI

Hackathon 2024 and 2025

- Students work in teams to find solutions to the sector's challenges.
- Participants come from educational institutions across Finland.
- The student teams pitch their ideas to a jury, who picks the winner.
- All teams' solutions are shared with member companies in the sector. The companies can make use of the ideas or develop them further.
- The hackathon has been organised three times. The two most recent ones have focused on generative AI in the financial sector.
- The 2026 hackathon will continue to focus on generative AI, but from a different viewpoint.



etäTET – Virtual introduction to working life

World's biggest etäTET 2020 →

- 14–17-year-olds have the chance to learn about working life in different sectors and industries.
- The world's biggest virtual TET work experience week gives the stage to several sectors, such as the financial sector, the commerce sector and the forest industry.
- The content is produced by industry associations and their member companies.
- The event is coordinated by Junior Achievement Finland (JA).
- JA ambassadors also take part in hosting the event.
- etäTET attracts 8,000–11,000 participants each year, most of them eighth and ninth-grade students or first-year upper secondary school students.



Instagram takeover takes viewers behind the scenes of day-to-day life in the financial sector

Let's take over Instagram!

- The *Finansialalle* Instagram account is handed over to member companies in summer and educational institutions in winter.
- The purpose of the takeovers is to showcase what day-to-day work in the sector looks like and what it's like to study for a career in the sector.
- During a takeover, the account is updated by summer employees, interns, students, teachers and student associations.
- Social media takeovers are one way to promote employer image and strengthen the public perception of the sector as a diverse workplace.
- *Finansialalle*'s Instagram account has about 3,000 followers.
